



STUDENT REGULATIONS

TELEPHONES

• Mobile Phones

Students are **not** encouraged to bring mobile phones to school. Phones are to be used at recess and lunch time only. Mobile phones should be turned off and locked inside lockers during class.



Any student using a mobile phone during class can expect to have it confiscated for the remainder of the day and a letter sent home to parents for a first offence. Students can collect the phone from Student Reception at the end of the day. Should a second and subsequent offence occur the phone is confiscated and only returned to a parent. Where students habitually break this regulation, they can also expect to receive additional consequences.

Additionally no student is allowed to take images of any student or staff member without the permission of the Principal or as part of the learning program. This includes off campus when students are in uniform and identifiable as a St Peter's student. Similarly it is against school policy to transmit these images out into the public domain. Students engaged in either of these activities can expect to have their mobile phone confiscated and will receive additional consequences that may include suspension depending on the incident.

ENVIRONMENT AND PROPERTY

Students have a right to learn in an environment which is safe, clean and conducive to learning. Students also have a responsibility to keep the environment that they work and play in clean and tidy. The following regulations assist in sharing the responsibilities for keeping our environment clean and our resources maintained at an appropriate standard so that we all benefit from their use.

• School Furniture, Equipment and Buildings

Students should respect the furniture, equipment and buildings provided for their education and use, recognising that all students have the right to access and use of safe and secure resources. Therefore, furniture, equipment and buildings should be:

- free of graffiti;
- free of damage;
- used appropriately at all times, e.g. not climbed on;
- where required, used under direct teacher supervision;
- returned to their original locations/positions.

• Computers and Computer Equipment

The computers and computer equipment in the College are for the use of all students. Each student using these resources should:

- follow the copyright laws;
- never download software, software tools, or application files on offer from the Internet;
- not access any socially unacceptable or illegal material at any time;
- not play, download or install any games;
- never give their password to any other student;
- never tamper with, or remove any piece of IT equipment.



• Personal Property

It is strongly recommended that no valuable personal possessions such as

- ipods;
- mobile phones;

be brought to or used at school. If they do come to school, it is at the student's own risk. These are to be used at recess and lunch time only and should be locked inside their lockers when not in use.



• Money

Large amounts of money should not be brought to school.

• Lockers

The College supplies a combination lock for each student when they start at the College, this is included in the school fees. If a lock needs to be replaced they can be purchased from the office for \$10.

• Student Cards

The College provides a student card for the purpose of borrowing books, photocopying and signing in and out of school. Student cards that are damaged through misuse or lost are to be replaced at a student's own expense. The replacement cost is \$5.

• Cyclists

Students riding to school are required to wear a bike helmet and observe road laws. Upon arrival at school, bikes must be placed in the bicycle compound. It is recommended that students use a bike lock because the bicycle compound will not always be locked.
